# FEATURE STORY

#### Jewell County Revitalization: 2023 Big Kansas Road Trip


"When we first found out that the Big Kansas Road Trip was coming to Jewell County and north central Kansas, we often heard people asking, 'Why would anyone want to come to Jewell County?" said Kyra Lampe, JCR Coordinator. "Little did we know that this event, which most Jewell County residents hadn't even heard of, would inspire our community to unite and display our best hospitality, kindness, and pride."

Jewell County, along with Republic and Smith Counties, hosted the 2023 Big Kansas Road Trip (BKRT) May 4-7. BKRT is an initiative of the Kansas Sampler Foundation that promotes local culture and economy in Kansas.

A \$5,000 grant from the Dane G. Hansen Community Grant Fund was used to help promote the event, and it paid off! During the weekend of the BKRT, two of Jewell County's most renowned attractions, including the museum and historical jail, each saw over 250 visitors in only three days. Prior to this, the museum would average less than 100 visitors per year, and the jail less than fifty. Two of Jewell County's most popular eateries, Sweden Creme and Nuthin' Fancy, reported their largest crowds ever since opening.

In addition, travelers were able to participate in one-of-a-kind experiences not regularly available outside of the BKRT, including the Market in the Park in Jewell, the viewing of the stained glass in Esbon at Sacred Heart of Jesus Catholic Church, and the handmade work by Charlie Fischer at his home and Esbon Community Church. Volunteers at the Formoso Skating Rink also graciously kept the rink open later in the season and welcomed a record-setting crowd. Overall, it is estimated that the BKRT brought in between 600-800 people throughout the weekend to Jewell County.

The success of BRKT can be attributed to the people of Jewell County. "We have an incredible community that supports one another," said Lampe. "Now we hear less of 'Why would anyone want to come to Jewell County?' and more of 'Why WOULDN'T you want to come to Jewell County?'"





# GRANTS AWARDED

The Community Foundation board accepts and reviews applications twice a year to address current community needs. This year, the committee awarded \$62,559 to 15 projects throughout the county.





Jewell County Strong: Daycare

A new fence around the Jewell County Strong Daycare's playground enabled them to get their license so they could officially open in August 2023. The daycare provides much needed childcare for the County, with space for 9-13 children. In addition to the fence, grant money was also used to buy a refrigerator and stove for the kitchen.

# APPRECIATED STOCKS & SECURITIES

## RETIREMENT ACCOUNT

- Avoid long-term capital gains tax by donating appreciated stocks or securities that you have owned for over a year.
- Receive a charitable income tax deduction based on the full fair market value of the security.
- Examples include gifts of stock, bonds, business interest, and cryptocurrency.
- Include the Foundation as a beneficiary of your retirement account. We receive the full amount and pay zero income tax, getting the entire benefit of your gift!
- If you are 70 1/2 or older you can contribute up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to the Foundation (except for donor advised funds) and avoid paying income taxes on the distribution.

**GRAIN** 

- Transfer and donate the grain to the Foundation's account at the grain elevator, and the Foundation sells it with proceeds going into the fund of your choice.
- Avoid income tax on the donated grain.
- Deduct the production cost of the donated grain if applicable.
