Grant Story

Esbon Rural Fire District #3 - Fire Siren Relocation and Securement

Dane G. Hansen Community Grant Fund (Jewell) - \$11,600

Esbon Fire Department was in need of an emergency generator at the firehouse and also wanted to relocate the siren from the water tower to the firehouse. Having a generator will ensure that the city will have a fully functioning siren at all times.

By installing a generator, the firehouse can maintain power during a storm allowing their emergency response teams to remain

unfazed by power outages. Relocating the siren to be independently powered by the newly installed generator was absolutely necessary to ensure public safety.

Without the grant through the Jewell County Community Foundation, this wouldn't have been possible. Not only does it benefit the fire department, it also benefits the entire Esbon community.







- 4.1% - Faith & Religion


